District Governor's Message





Dear Fellow Lions and Leos,

As we complete the Thanksgiving season and prepare for the upcoming holidays, try to carry that "Attitude of Gratitude" throughout the New Year.

As Lions and individuals, we are called to be friends with others, to advocate for those who cannot speak for themselves, to encourage those who are depressed, to guide those who need additional help; and to comfort those who have lost loved ones.

Still, we need to think about our many blessings. While many of us are facing cataract surgery and poorer vision, we are still better off than 39 million people throughout the world who have no sight. Some of us have hearing aids or are approaching the time when we will need to get them, but here in the United States, 30 million individuals over the age of 12 have hearing loss in both ears!

While many of us are happily retired, younger workers may eagerly be anticipating the time when they can travel or spend more time with family and friends. Yet, throughout the world, more than 214 million people have no job!

Likewise, we each have a place to call home, but globally, it is estimated that more than 150 million people are homeless.

You are also blessed if you have family and friends who care about you because nearly 28% of older American adults live alone. Of course, with the decline of family life, as well as more people working from home, or relocating for employment opportunities, 22% of millennials are lonely and depressed!

We also need to be grateful that we can read a newspaper, magazine, book, or the Internet because the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development found that 50% of American adults cannot read at an 8th grade level, while 70% of those who are in prison cannot read past a fourth grade level!

Now, this article was not meant to depress you. Instead, it was to encourage you to not only recall your blessings, but to see that Lions and Leos have MANY opportunities to serve during the holidays and throughout the coming year. 

Ensuring that your district is appealing to younger people means evaluating all the options that your district offers them in these various stages, including sponsoring Leo clubs and offering different Lions club types.

Assess the strengths and weaknesses in your area regarding younger members, and then develop a plan to recruit them. Ask local Leos and young lions for feedback. Do you have clubs that have different meeting styles and locations? Are your clubs open to new ideas and willing to intentionally recruit younger members? The [Connecting to Young Lions](#) guide can help clubs with these assessments, and the [Young Lion Membership Guide](#) identifies ways that younger members can serve and the benefits available to them. The [Leo program](#) is also a wonderful way to engage people aged 18-30. When you partner with Leos, you build a district that is more attractive to young people overall. This can lead to an increase in Leo-Lions and their friends joining your clubs. Partner with your district Leo chairperson to ensure that Leos in their last year of service in the Leo program are encouraged to become Lions. You can learn more about the Leo to Lion transition process in the *Beyond Leos* course in the Lions Learning Center.


MURRYSVILLE LIONS DELIVER “MANNA BACKPACKS” TO HELP THOSE IN NEED AT WELCOME HOME SHELTER, GREENSBURG

Welcome Home Shelter is an emergency shelter that offers a clean, safe place to stay for families and single women experiencing homelessness. Welcome Home provides 30-60 days of emergency shelter and can accommodate four families and ten single women at the same time. Historically, the shelter provides services to about 250 women, children and men annually. Through other agencies, residents also receive life skill training. The Murrysville Lions Club provided "manna" backpacks to residents. The backpacks were tailored to the recipient...a woman, child, or man. Generally, the backpacks contained such items as toothbrush and toothpaste, body wash, heavy socks, etc. The color-coded backpacks...red for women, green for men, and yellow for children... were purchased by the Club and clearly marked with the identity of the Club along with the Lions Club insignia. For the first delivery, the club financed the costs associated with the manna backpacks...the cost of making backpacks and approximately \$15 of items in each backpack. Our Lions Club packed the backpacks. The Club delivered the filled backpacks November 18, 2022: the first delivery included backpacks for 14 women, two men, two girls, two boys, one teen girl and one teen boy.

Going forward the Club plans to seek the assistance of the community to fill the backpacks, including three area supermarkets. These have tentatively indicated they will allow displays in their stores that solicit customers to help provide supplies for this project. The Club judges that such donations will provide sustainability for this project, creating a signature project for the Club.






BEACON LODGE FUNDRAISING FACEBOOK BIRTHDAY CHALLENGE!
