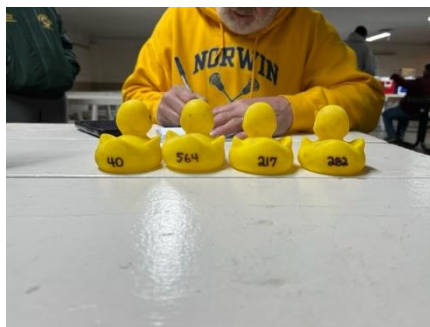

ID Jay Moughon Notes from the recent Spring Board Meeting

- **President Brian Sheehan** outlined his four priorities.
 - Share the joy of being a Lion. Letting people know what and why we do things is our biggest recruiting tool.
 - When you have a service project, think big. Stretch yourselves; you will be surprised by what you can accomplish.
 - Keep our Foundation strong to continue to serve worldwide. Please send individual contributions, and recognize those who donate.
 - Only 58% of our clubs report service activities each month. Accurate reporting enables us to prove our global impact and encourage corporations to help us in our endeavors.
- These are the highlights from **selected committee reports**:
- **Convention:**
 - Expect 12,000 Lions to attend the convention in Boston.
 - Bid for New Delhi convention in 2029 has been rescinded due to the distance of the Hotels (60 – 90 minutes from convention site) and no area for a parade.
 - The committee is examining the possibility of shortening future international conventions by one day.
- **Long-range planning committee:**
 - An ad-hoc committee will study ID representation i.e., redistribution of IDs within the constitutional areas. (The US, Constitutional Area 1, will probably lose another Director position, thus further diminishing our clout.)
- **Service activities:**
 - Only 58% of the clubs worldwide report service activities on a monthly basis, and the numbers will probably drop during the summer due to new officer transitions and a new reporting platform.
 - The committee is looking into establishing a service reporting award.
- **Constitution and By-laws:**
 - Delegates to the International Convention will vote on an amendment to allow districts below 1,250 members and 35 clubs to run a candidate for international office. If passed, it will take effect following the 2023 Boston Convention..
- **Leadership:**
 - o The training for second vice district governors is being revamped to include the courses that were previously included in the Advanced Lions Leadership Institute (ALLI). Consequently, ALLI will be discontinued in 2024.

For those of you who are serving as club delegates for the Multiple District Convention, there are two ballot questions to consider:

BALLOT QUESTION #1

THE RESOLUTION ADDS LANGUAGE WAIVING ANNUAL MULTIPLE DISTRICT DUES (\$16) FOR LEO TO LION MEMBERS THROUGH AGE THIRTY-FIVE.

BE IT RESOLVED that effective July 1, 2023, By-Laws Article VI, Section 1 will read as follows:

Section 1: Multiple District Revenue – To provide revenue to defray the administrative expenses of this Multiple District and of each Sub-District hereof and a Multiple Convention Fund, annual per capita dues of \$16.00 is hereby levied upon each member of each club in the Multiple District. The dues are waived for Lions Club student members as defined by Lions Clubs International and for Leo to Lion members through age thirty-five.

BALLOT QUESTION #2

THE RESOLUTION UPDATES LANGUAGE FROM 51% OF THE TOTAL NUMBER OF MEMBERS OF THE CLUBS TO SIMPLE MAJORITY.

BE IT RESOLVED that effective May 21, 2023, By-Laws Article IX, Section 1(a)(b) AMENDING PROCEDURE will read as follows:

The By-Laws may be amended only at the multiple district convention by amendment reported by the Committee on Constitution and By-Laws at such annual meeting and adopted by the affirmative vote of the majority of the certified delegates voting at such meeting. No amendment shall be reported to a convention for vote unless it shall first secure approval in one of the following two methods:

Section 1(a): Have been approved by the Council of Governors

Section 1(b): Have been approved by resolution of convention of a sub-district representing no less than the majority of the total number of members for the clubs of the sub-districts as of July 1 of the fiscal year in which the amendment is submitted to the Council of Governors for ballot placement.

Membership

You've worked so hard all year to bring in new members. Now it's time to think about how to keep those new members as well as those who have been Lions for a while. Retention is closely tied to member satisfaction. Simply put, happy Lions don't leave. They stay engaged, seek ways to improve their clubs, and spread the word to potential recruits.

Lions International recently conducted a global survey of former Lions to find out why they left. The three most common answers were conflict in the club, lack of feeling of belonging, and not having enough time to devote to being a Lion. This is good news in that clubs can have a direct impact on all of these issues.

Let's start by talking about the most common reason Lions leave—conflict in the club. The key is to identify and diffuse conflict before it becomes a problem. These skills are taught in the *Conflict Resolution* course in the Lions Learning Center. We highly recommend that all Lion leaders take this course to learn how to manage disputes in a fair and productive way.

A lack of feeling of belonging was the second most popular answer. People can serve their communities by themselves, but they become Lions to be a part of a group of likeminded individuals. Encourage your club membership chairpersons to get to know each member, especially those who are new or don't have many friends in the club. Teach them how to identify signs of pulling away like reduced attendance at events and reduced engagement. A simple "How are you?" can mean a lot to someone feeling like an outsider.

Most Lions have work and family commitments competing for their limited time. There are a variety of ways your clubs can be more flexible to accommodate busier schedules. Have your clubs ask their members if their usual meeting time is still the best time for most people. Perhaps a club branch could be formed for those who can't make the normal meeting time. You can encourage clubs to allow Lions to meet virtually.

Don't forget to add or change member info into the MyLCI website. The Lions are combining MyLion, MyLCI and Insights, along with some additional tools and functionality, into a unified experience called the Lion Portal. The new portal will offer the same features and functionality currently available, but with a more consistent and efficient experience. All changes must be in by June 15th.

Update your Lion Account information

Make sure your Lion Account information is correct and up to date in MyLCI or your regional reporting system. Note that the new Lion Portal will require a unique, unshared email, and phone numbers will no longer be supported as a log in credential.

If you're a club president, secretary or administrator, updating member information is simple:

- Log in to the current member portal with your Lion Account credentials
- Navigate to MyLCI
- Select "My Lions Club"
- Select "Members"
- Click on the member whose information you need to update.
- Select "Edit Member" to enter in their revised email address and other updated information.

Mission – To empower Lions Clubs, volunteers, and partners to improve health and well-being, strengthen communities, and support those in need through humanitarian services and grants that impact lives globally, and encourage peace and international understanding.

Mission – To assist those afflicted with sensory impairment, particularly those relating to vision and hearing. To award grants in support of meritorious projects and programs for the sensory impaired and to join with individual Pennsylvania Lions Clubs in responding to local, community, and regional needs. The important thing is that all money remains in Pennsylvania.

Both groups have grant funding mechanisms that help provide financial support to Lions projects locally and around the world. LCIF has different grant types and resources that are available for Clubs, Districts, or Multiple Districts along with funding that supports places in the world that face catastrophe and disasters. Many of the grants available center around our global projects such as sight, diabetes, hunger, and childhood cancer.

The LOPF offers matching grants that help support projects in Pennsylvania. A Lions Club that applies for a grant must show that it has plans to attain at least 50% of the project funding from a Lions Club (or Clubs) or another local source to the project. The LOPF manages and distributes funding to help Lions Clubs provide Services to meet the needs and emerging needs that will improve the quality of life of the residents of Pennsylvania. Like LCIF, the LOPF has recently adopted guidelines for processing donations made by Pennsylvania Lions and supporters to disasters. These funds are processed to the cause as directed by the donors wishes even when the disaster is not in the state's borders. It allows the generosity of PA Lions to be shared with those in need through a tax-deductible donation to our local foundation.

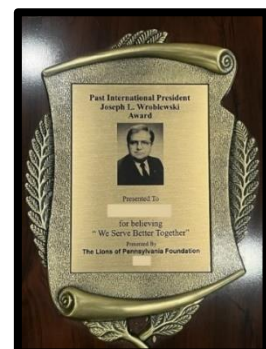
Donations to each of these foundations is what makes their grant programs possible. These donations also come in the form of purchasing the awards that both groups offer.

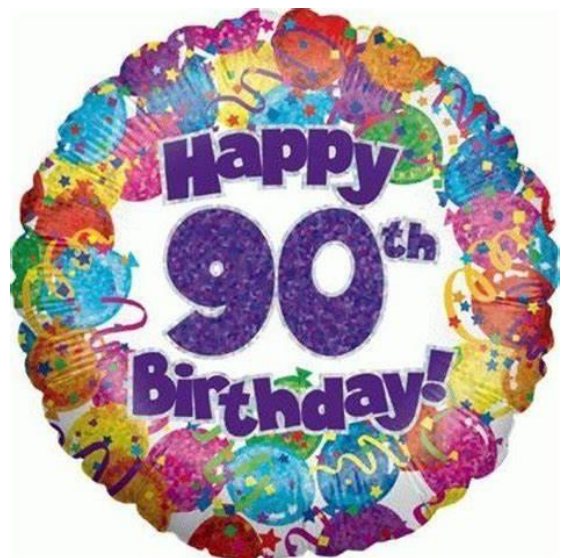

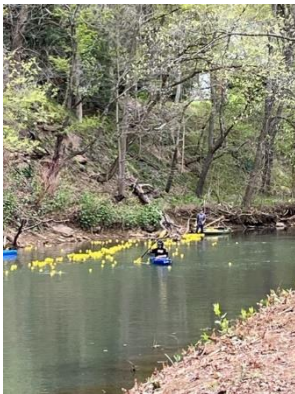

LIONS REBRANDING

Some of you may have read that Lions International is rebranding. Because one of the most visible ways to strengthen our Association and Foundation is to unify Lions Clubs International and Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF)

With that in mind, our Association is introducing "Lions International" as our unified "umbrella" or master brand to represent both our Association and Foundation. Nevertheless, the individual names of both of these will not change. They will continue to be separate legal entities, and we will continue to use "Lions Clubs International" when referring specifically to the association, and "Lions Clubs International Foundation" when referring to LCIF. Together, they will be referred to as "Lions International."

Furthermore, our Lions International emblem, which is recognized around the world, is not changing, and our Lions Clubs International and Lions Clubs International Foundation brands will remain the same. Nevertheless, during the new brand roll out, Lions International will provide updates and guidance to help us align with the new Lions International brand that will introduce a logo with the words "Lions International," along with our emblem, to use as part of our Lions International branding.

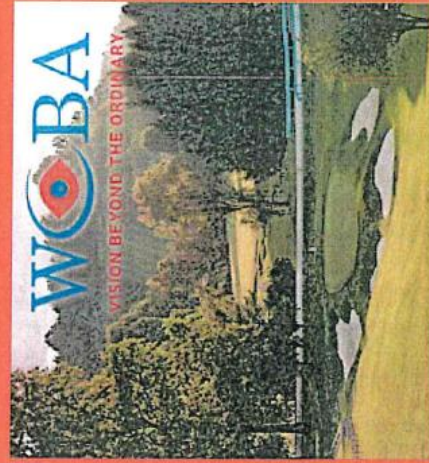

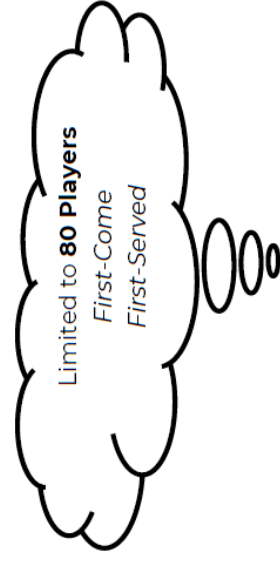

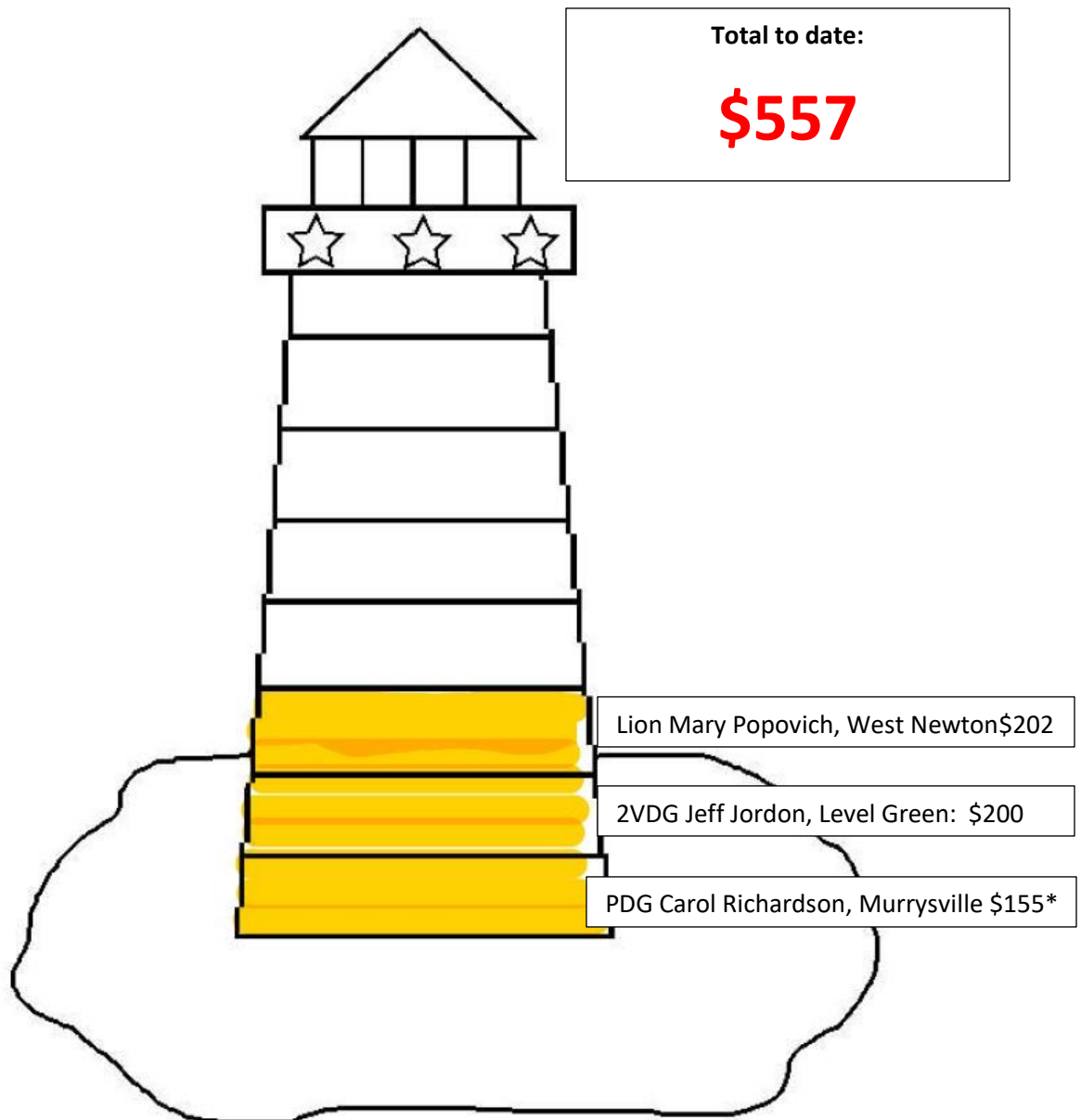

BUSHY RUN – 37 members. No report.

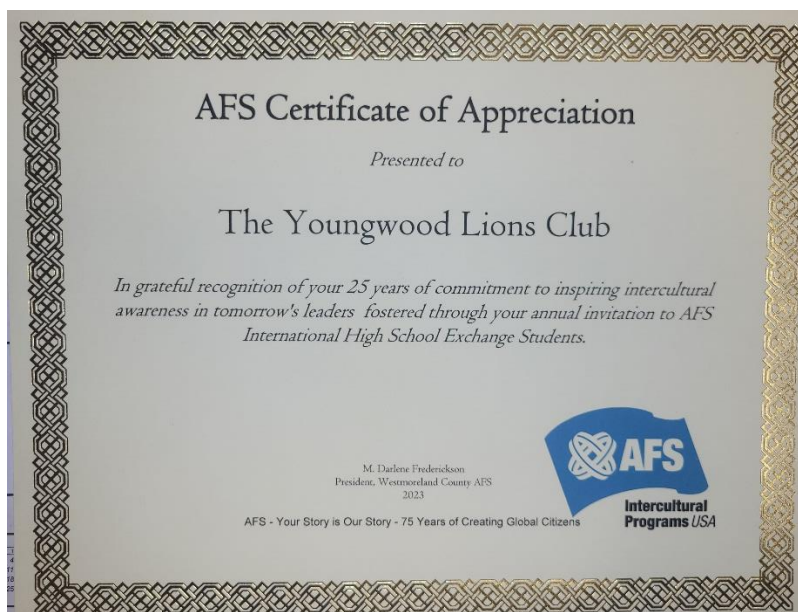
NORWIN – 32 members. Elected officers and board for the 2023-2024 Lion year. Collected eyeglasses and hearing aids. Sold brooms.
