WOMEN AND FAMILIES IN LIONS

There are so many things to be thankful for this year and the month of May provides a special opportunity to show appreciation for the beautiful gift of motherhood. Writing articles for the Lions newsletter provides a perfect opportunity for me to investigate why certain days of each month are a cause for celebration. Even though many other events happen in May, I wanted to focus on Mother's Day, simply because this article is focused on women and families.

I was not sure how this day came to be, and I was surprised to find out it started way back during the American Civil War. A young woman named Anna Marie Jarvis was inspired by her mother, who served wounded soldiers in the American Civil War. After the loss of her own mother, she wanted a way to celebrate the lives of her mother, as well as others. It just so happened her mother's favorite flower was a white carnation. Therefore, in 1908, Anna held a memorial ceremony in a church in Grafton, West Virginia to honor all deceased mothers. She sent every attendant a white Carnation, which totaled about 500 flowers. Since then, white Carnations are given or worn out of remembrance of a mother who is no longer living. Red Carnations became the flower to represent living mothers, so now I have made it easy to know the appropriate type of flowers to send to your mother.

I was also surprised to discover; President Woodrow Wilson took this tradition one step further by designating the second Sunday in May as the official Mother's Day Celebration in the United States. This is a day when families may express respect, honor, and love towards their birth mother, or adopted mother or someone who has been like a mother to them. It is a day which should make people remember the importance and significance of mothers in their life and is a day to give special emphasis to the motherly figures around the world. Many celebrations include a day off for Mom, where she is pampered by her family, with breakfast in bed, or a luxury spa treatment, virtual cooking class, a visit to her favorite restaurant, or that special homemade card. Take this day to do something special for your mother and make it a day she will remember forever!

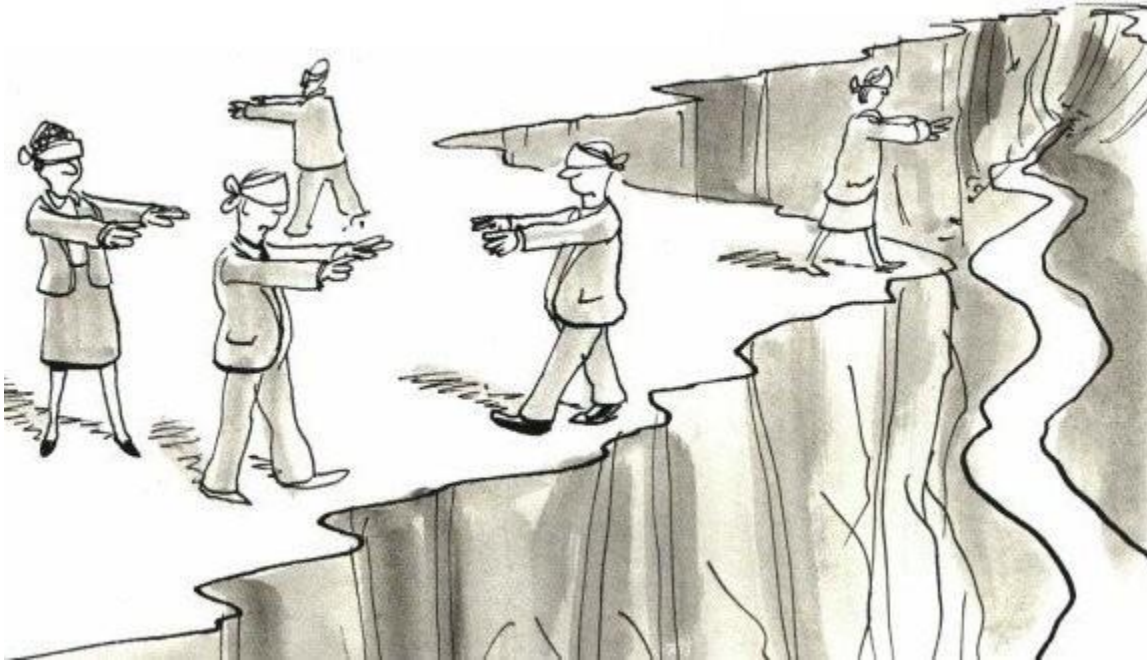

Leadership

Going Leader-Less

Every organization or business has some type of leadership structure to maintain order and keep things running smoothly. As the great staffing crisis continues, we see stores and restaurants increasing the number of self-order, self-checkout, and self-service options. Is it worth exploring such an option for Lions? Could we survive at different levels of our organization without leaders?

Imagine a leader-less club? No King Lion/president to keep things in order. Perhaps a leader-less zone or district? Is it even possible? No one to communicate priorities. No one to offer assistance or guidance when needed. No one to challenge us to do better and meet our obligations. Would it be possible?

Fellow Lions, we are very close to finding out. Over the past four years, we have been working very hard to recruit new leaders from across the county to help lead us Lions into the next decade. We are failing miserably.

We have a very serious leadership problem in our clubs and district right now. It will not be fixed by a single person. We need everyone's help.

With the start of our new Lions year on July 1, our district will have only one dedicated zone chair for the entire district where we need a minimum of 4. We need your help to either volunteer to serve as a zone chair or help us find new zone chairs. It is a very unfortunate situation for all our Lions clubs as they are losing a key resource to get the assistance they need for their clubs.

If you would like to learn more about serving as a zone chairperson or our zone chair shadowing program to test the waters, please contact myself, the District Governor, or any of the Vice District Governors, or current zone chairs. If you enjoy meeting and working with new people, networking, and problem-solving, this could be a great experience for you! Without trying to sound too much like a telethon pitch, we really do need your help!

Service

Club Level GSTs and MyLion Reporting

Clubs should have elected officers by this time of the Lions Year. If your Club does not have a Club level GST, and many of our Clubs in the District do not, you should also be looking to fill this position as well. I know Club membership numbers make it hard to fill every position that is asked of them.

This is a position that does not require a lot of up-front training and can be something you use to recruit a member for. “Hey, your organization skills and the way you keep track of things are something we really need in our Club right now. I’ve asked you to be a member before but right now we could really use your help for something specific.” Then you can tell them a little bit about the position and how the GST helps coordinate, fundraise for, and report service projects.

The GST is in no means the person responsible for all these things so don’t scare the person away. As the District GST I will gladly help to plan, coordinate, and run projects at the District level when asked. Examples are the food packing project of a few years ago and the recent items collections after the natural disasters. We do this all together to make things the success that they are. The more of us doing things means the easier it is on the members and the more success we have in our efforts.

Reporting is something we continue to want to see this happen and right now we are doing terrible at here in the District. I struggle because if I have time in a day to do something, it is not normally time to spend in writing about something I have already done. DG Margie has a goal of 100% service reporting. There is still time for this. I am asking that everyone here today go back and be sure that your Club Secretary, Club GST, or Club President are reporting your Service activities on MyLion. Let’s work to support DG Margie’s goals and to provide data that helps us measure our impact as Lions.

Service reporting through MyLion is not hard though and there are many resources both in print and personal help that can guide you through it.

If you are looking for help online go to Google and search for ‘MyLion reporting guide’ and a lot of information comes up. One of the first things you will see is the Service Reporting page on Lions Clubs International’s website. This page contains a lot of information about how and why Service Reporting is so important. Scroll down the page and you will find the section of Tools and Resources which include the MyLion How to Report and Celebrate Service Guide.

CABINET MEETING
APRIL 9, 2022
BEACON LODGE REPORT



The March Board of Directors meeting was held at the Camp with both 14-E Directors and 1 liaison in attendance, along with other Board members, both in person and virtually.

Executive Director Lion Jonathan reported that 2 employees resigned – a maintenance worker and the camp coordinator. The maintenance position has been filled and staff is seeking to fill the coordinator position. Plans for the upcoming camping season are moving forward. As of the March meeting, 2 nurses, a kitchen supervisor, 2 kitchen helpers, 2 housekeepers and 2 maintenance workers have been hired. 17 counselors and 2 unit directors are needed for the season; 3 counselors have signed up and there are several prospects as the result of a recent recruiting fair. Work week-ends are scheduled for April 8-10 and 22-23 (which will include the Leos).

Director of Operations Casey gave a detailed report of monthly activities and projects held at the Camp and a list of projects for the work week-ends was provided.

The Camp's audit was completed, which reported no issues, and included some recommendations to staff.

According to the contribution summaries I received, 14-E contributed \$2,140 from October 2021 through September 2022, which included donations to the operating budget, camp sponsorships and the 500 Club. FYI, 14-E donations to the 500 Club since its inception in 1992 total \$41,652.48. It was noted that if every Lion in Pennsylvania donated \$5.00, that would raise enough money to cover the operating expenses for the year.

The newly-hired Director of Development, who is responsible for fundraising with the focus on non-Lions funding and grants, was in attendance and presented a lot of information. The target goal for this individual would be to raise \$100,000 in the first year.

Please plan to attend the Lions Appreciation Day on July 17 and don't forget the golf outing on August 27. Please support the golf outing by sending a foursome, sponsoring a hole or golf cart, or simply making a donation to the outing.

Remember Lions – this is YOUR camp (PA LIONS CAMP BEACON LODGE) and you should support it as much as possible by donating, purchasing a brick for a deserving member, supporting the 500 Club, presenting a Shoemaker Fellowship, visiting and promoting the facility. The 14-E Directors and Liaisons will be happy to visit your club to provide more information about the Camp.
