Message from the Second Vice District Governor

Serving with Heart: Lions Focus on Mental Health

This month we recognize Mental Health and Well-Being, a reminder that even the simplest changes can affect people in very different ways.

October 4-12, Lions around the world will be observing a Week of Service for Mental Health and Well-Being. During this time, we will come together to raise awareness and show support for this important cause. Lions International President A.P. Singh has incorporated mental health and well-being as one of our service initiatives, reminding us that caring for mental health is just as vital as addressing physical needs in our communities.

I want to share a personal story of how even a slight change can

affect someone's well-being. When COVID-19 began, my company sent us home to work. I quickly realized how much I enjoyed it — and Istill do. Removing the commute and having more flexibility in my day has been a very positive change for me. While there were some adjustments to make, overall, the experience benefited my well-being.

What I didn't realize at first was how differently this same change impacted some of my colleagues. For one colleague, it took a major toll. Living alone, the daily interaction at work had been their primary source of connection to others. When that was suddenly gone, their mental health suffered in ways that weren't immediately obvious.

The good thing was I noticed. Others noticed. We noticed. And together, we took steps to support this person during a time when contact was so limited. It wasn't always easy, but we made sure they felt seen, heard, and cared for. Today, that colleague is thriving, and to this day they thank me for recognizing they were not okay and for stepping in during a difficult transition.

My own experience taught me a powerful lesson: what may be positive for one person can be incredibly challenging for another. That's why it is so important that we continue to check in — on ourselves and on each other. Sometimes the smallest act of kindness or concern can become the turning point in

someone's life.

Together, as Lions, let's lead with awareness, compassion, and action — because mental health and wellbeing matter for all.

District 14-E Lions: I encourage each of you and your clubs to take part in this Week of Service or during the month of October and share the projects you are doing to raise awareness for mental health and well-being. By working together, we can shine a light on this important cause and make a real difference in our communities.



Promote education, awareness and advocacy resources and tools from reputable organizations such as the World Health Organization and World Federation for Mental Health.



Explore the World Health Organization's mental health and well-being stigma reduction resources and promote them using social media to highlight the importance of lessening mental health stigma and debunking common misconceptions.



Contact local, state/province and federal government representatives to advocate for increased mental health funding and expanded services. Use our <u>Lions</u>
<u>Advocacy Toolkit</u> to get started.



Explore ways to increase access to vital mental health screening services in your community among underserved groups by contacting and utilizing mental health professionals, psychologists and psychiatric physicians in your networks. Connect with local stakeholders such as schools, hospitals and community leaders to collaborate on shared goals.



Find your region or country's suicide prevention hotline using the <u>International</u> Association for Suicide Prevention's international suicide crisis hotline search feature and promote the hotline at awareness events and on social media.



Use resources, facts and statistics from the World Health Organization and World Federation for Mental Health to create a World Mental Health Day social media campaign with your club, district or multiple district. Share your impact on social media with photos, videos and other assets using the hashtag #WorldMentalHealthDay.



Donate food, toiletries or maintenance services to a local transitional living home serving disabled individuals and/or those living with various mental health conditions in your community.



Host a walk or event in partnership with a local mental health organization to raise mental health and well-being awareness utilizing the World Health Organization's mental well-being resources and depression infographics.





Volunteer at your local center for elderly care to assist with enrichment and well-being events.



Support Lions Quest social-emotional learning and well-being curriculum for youth in your community. Consider providing promotional support and curriculum delivery for Lions Quest by applying for a Lions. Quest Promotional Grant or Lions Quest. Community Partnership Grant



Use resources from the International Association for Suicide Prevention to highlight World Suicide Prevention Day in your community.



Provide assistance to mental health agencies and treatment centers by hosting fundraisers, providing publicity on social media and collecting needed supplies.

Did you know that over 820 million people in the world don't have enough food to eat? Did you know that 45% of children under the age of five die from nutrition related causes? Did you know that in the United States alone, one in nine people suffer from hunger? Did you know that Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) offers grants to Lions Districts ranging from \$10,000-\$100,000 to aid in eliminating Hunger?

Hunger issues are increasing steadily, and LCIF Hunger Grants can be used to support school feeding pro-

Message from Cindy Gregg

Dear Lions and Leos,

Although the 49th USA/Canada Lions Leadership Forum concluded last weekend, it was an exciting three days filled with nearly 100 educational sessions, outstanding inspirational speakers, and the great camaraderie for which Lions is known. More than 1600 Lions and Leos came together to fill hundreds of boxes with towels, socks, and essential supplies that were donated to five homeless shelters. While the weather wasn't ideal for the Strides Walk, \$7500 was donated to the local Diabetes Center. Of course, the chairman, a mother of a young diabetic son, tearfully accepted this heartfelt contribution.

International President AP Singh, from India, known for his dynamic speeches, drew an interesting parallel between our membership efforts and gambling in Atlantic City's many casi-

nos. After all, "You can't win if you don't take a chance." Similarly, we can't recruit members if we don't ask!

Former LSU and Pittsburgh Pirate Warren Morris shared his story of perseverance, despite his injuries. He could have easily given up, but he "stayed the course," leading LSU to win the 1996 College World Series and then receiving an Olympic Bronze Medal later that summer.

However, it was Lion BJ Blahnik, from Wisconsin, who truly stole the show on Saturday evening. Diagnosed with retinitis pigmentosa at the age of ten, BJ shared his journey from being bullied for being clumsy and awkward in grade school to contemplating suicide in sixth grade. Fortunately, there were others who intervened and got him the help he needed. In fact, his life was transformed when he visited Leader Dogs for the Blind and received his first leader dog. Through much determination, he forged ahead, met his wife, participated in the Olympics, and founded Reach Forward to assist those individuals with special needs. His touching story made us laugh; cry, and cheer for this amazing human being!

As the Forum drew to a close, next year's Host Committee provided a rousing invitation to the 2026 USA'Canada Lions Leadership Forum. With Elvis in the house, and pictures of the zoo, Graceland, the Civil Rights Museum, and many other sights, they promised a memorable 50th anniversary celebration from September 3-5, 2026 in Memphis, Tennessee. Please consider adding this to your plans for next year. You won't be sorry.
