

District 14-E will be having a Book Drive for Pediatric Cancer patients at Hershey Medical Center in time for Christmas!



Dear Fellow Lions,

Nearly every day, we have been receiving text messages and weather alerts warning of an impending disaster someplace in the world. Just this past month, we witnessed the devastation in Florida, Maui, Morrocco, Libya, and Bermuda.

Our Foundation needs your support. Unlike many other charitable organizations, ALL money that you donate to Lions Clubs International Foundation is used for humanitarian purposes.

Contrary to popular belief, all of those funds are NOT sent offshore. In fact, during the five years that LCIF collected for Campaign 100, Pennsylvania received more than \$440,000 in grants! That's amazing! Of course, those grants exceeded our Multiple District's donations.

Furthermore, are you aware that your club can earn money toward a grant? 15 percent of unrestricted contributions (those that are made to the Empowering Service Fund) are converted into District and Club Community Impact Grants (DCCIG) to fund local projects at the club or district level.

Nevertheless, to qualify for the District & Club Community Impact Grant, a club must donate a minimum of \$5,000 within the fiscal year (July 1 – June 30). Likewise, the district must submit a minimum donation of \$10,000 donation. Because of your generosity, District 14-E has earned \$3,319 toward a grant, and the Rostraver Township Lions Club earned \$889.86 which they are planning to use for a food packaging program.

Consequently, these donations are supporting those in our community and district who need assistance. Please consider donating TODAY.

From LCIF:

Thank you for supporting Lions Clubs International Foundation's Relief efforts. It is important to note that when major disasters occur, the local Lions on the ground are the ones who help implement projects, with LCIF funding support. In some cases, with major disasters, there is no immediate update — as search and recovery efforts are occurring, debris is removed, and Lions are planning for long-term reconstruction. Lions are often not first responders or experts in disaster relief. Therefore, long-term efforts sometimes take years for Lions to implement.

Please see updates below.

Morocco Earthquake

• On the morning of September 9, LCIF awarded an Emergency Grant for \$10,000 to help fund immediate basic needs. Later that same day on September 9th, LCIF awarded an additional Major Catastrophe grant for \$100,000. Lions of Morocco are still working to finalize plans on how to use the Major Catastrophe funding, but they are looking at supporting infrastructure related to schools and education. Additional grant funding may be available in the future, depending on donations and Lions plans for additional efforts.

Libya Flooding

There are no Lions active in Libya. Consequently, LCIF has not awarded any grants to Libya thus
far, as there are no local Lions to manage a project. Nevertheless, there are some preliminary
discussions about how LCIF can support efforts, but it may be difficult with no Lions' presence
in the country.

US/Canada Hurricane Lee

• LCIF has not yet received any applications from the impacted districts. However, disaster grants are available if the impacted districts and Lions wish to apply. This is early days after the hurricane, so it is possible that local Lions are working on a plan.

Other Disasters

• LCIF continues funding disasters around the world that do not make international news headlines. Since July 1, 2023, \$610,000 has been awarded across 21 different countries for a variety of different disasters. In areas where more long-term reconstruction LCIF will work with local Lions on relief efforts for years to come.

BRING SOMEONE

Bring Someone is the idea of bringing in new Members, orienting Members in what Lionism is about, and constantly engaging Lions so that they feel a sense of satisfaction through Service and Leadership so that their Membership is retained.

Bring Someone - It starts with one.

I am starting this article by congratulating all membership efforts, but I want to mention one. Clubs that are struggling with membership need to start somewhere. It doesn't matter if your Club has 20+ members or 5 or less. It starts with one. Nice work Trafford Lions and new member sponsor Casey Kilroy!!

Bring Someone – It starts with one continued.

Your Club needs new Members. You know that. You might have projects that you'd like to do but cannot. Your leadership might be overextended carrying multiple roles. You have community needs that are not being addressed. New Members will help with all of these.

We need continued growth in our Lions Clubs. That doesn't mean you have to bring in 10, 5, 3, or 2 members. It's as simple as bringing in one new member. What can that person do? What are their skills? Who do they know? What is their energy level? A new Member can be all it takes to revitalize a Lions Club.

Did your Club bring in one new Member last year? What about the last 5 years, have you increased Membership by at least one Member? There are Clubs that have not. This is your goal start with one. It can be accomplished too.

Bring Someone - How do you sell your Lions Club?

Last month we talked about 3-minute Membership. Another time related thing we need to be aware of as Lions is our 30-second elevator speech for Lions. This is the thing you'd say if you were in an elevator with a non-Lion and they saw your Lions shirt on and said, "What do Lions do?" We now have them as a captive audience and have their attention maybe as long as it takes to get to their floor.

You need to come up with something you will say and practice it. I know I have been guilty of giving bad answers when asked what Lions are. What are Lions? "Uh uh we do chicken BBQs and sell brooms." What does your Lions Club do? "Uh we used to do this or that but can't anymore because we don't have the members. Do you want to join? We could use you as a Lion. You

If we aren't prepared to be asked this question, we can easily chase a person off before they even hear a few sentences. We can overwhelm a person before they ever see the good in the service that we do.

Figure out a few key points. Give some highlights that catch their interest. Remember that Lions is more than what you do in your Club. If you get their attention maybe, they will ask more.

I just asked a fellow Slickville Lion what he tells people when they ask what Lions are and he said, "I tell them we are the Knights of the Blind following what Helen Keller asked us to do. I then tell them that we raise and provide Leader Dogs." He hit the key history and a popular program. If that opens the door maybe that 30-seconds can be more. Then you can ask them to be a future District Governor. Easy now, I am kidding. That will come in time.

Bring Someone – Benefits of Membership

What are the reasons that you are a Lion? It starts with one and that one was you. Now you continue to be a Lion for some reason. You are learning about and experiencing more about what we do serving the community. You are part of the world's largest service organization — Lions International. Your connection to this group makes more possible. You bring something to Lions in the skills that you had prior to becoming a Lion. Now there are other

opportunities for you to expand those skills. Do you know that Lions International offers training online? Have you attended a MD14 State Council Meeting, an LCI Convention or Forum for trainings there? Just being a Lion makes us all part of a group with new people. There are many agencies that provide grief counseling as well as coping strategies.

There are many coping projects you can do when you are faced with this tricky situation. You can make a memory quilt of your loved one's favorite t-shirts, or open a trust fund for the children, or provide something personal for the child to keep. There are many other ideas or produce one of your own that has meaning and bring comfort to your broken heart.
