It was a fitting start to the year building on President Lyon's call to reconnect with our roots and a reminder that District 14E's clubs are strongest when we show up, roll up our sleeves, and serve. August 2026 LCIF Newsletter Note

Fellow Lions,

I would like to provide an update on our District's LCIF donations for the past year. We achieved 77% of our assigned goal, and we were the 4th highest District in MD14! I am very proud of this accomplishment and hope we can surpass it for this upcoming year.

As always, I will be checking to ensure that ALL clubs have designated someone to be their club's LCIF chair. If not, the King Lion will be assigned this duty in order to get the word out to all club members. Please have your assignments entered to the portal by Aug 14th.

Just a little update, since 1968, LCIF has provided over

24,000 grants, over \$173 million for disaster relief, over 20 million successful Lions Quest Students, and completed 9.8 million cataract surgeries to those in need around the world. And knowing we were a part of that means so much as we were able to help those in need.

A little announcement, I was asked to be the LCIF Co-Coordinator for Multiple District 14 (the state of Pennsylvania), and after some thought and consideration, I accepted that position. In doing so, it was suggested that I have a Co-Chair at the District Level, and it was suggested that PDG Chuck be my partner in crime. After more thought and consideration,

he also accepted. So, we will both be promoting LCIF to the District and the Clubs in the upcoming months. We will be attending the annual LCIF training from 8/14/26-8/17/26 in New Orleans, and when we return, we will be contacting all clubs to schedule a visit in order to provide updates and increase your knowledge and understanding of LCIF!

Lions International President MARK S. LYON

Mark S. Lyon, from Brookfield, Connecticut was elected to serve as President of Lions Clubs International at the association's 108th international convention held in Hong Kong, China from July 3 through July 7, 2026.

Prior to his retirement in March 2024, President Lyon worked in corporate legal administration and financial services with several major corporations and banks for over 40 years. As a long-time resident of Brookfield and an active volunteer in his community, church and local government, his connection with Lions was already well established before becoming a member of the Brookfield Lions Club in 1996.

Since then, he has held numerous offices within the association, including international director, multiple district

council chairperson and multiple district GLT coordinator. He was also appointed as a member of the LCI Forward project team, a Global Action Team Area Leader, a District Governor-Elect Seminar group leader and board liaison to the 2019 USA/Canada Lions Leadership Forum Executive Committee.

President Lyon has also served as a presenter, as well as a faculty and participant at countless training events and leadership forums throughout the years.

In recognition of his service, Lion Mark has received multiple International President's Awards and International President's Certificates of Appreciation, including an International President's Leadership Award.

Vice President Lyon is also a recipient of the Ambassador of Good

Will Award, the highest honor the association bestows upon its members. Additionally, he has been recognized as a Connecticut Knight of the Blind and a Connecticut Ambassador of Sight. Likewise, he is the recipient of a number of project and service-related certificates.

President Lyon has also been active in numerous professional and community organizations. He served on the board of directors for the Silver Lake Conference Center and Wide Horizons for Children. He was an associate member of the American Bar Association and a past member of the Association of Legal Administrators, the Society of Corporate Secretaries



and Governance Professionals, and the Shareholder Services Association.

President Lyon and his wife, Lion Lyn, also a long time Lion, are both Progressive Melvin Jones Fellows and are the proud parents of three incredible daughters.

Joseph L. Wroblewski, 96, Past International President of Lions Clubs International, a member of our PA Lions International Family

Joseph L. Wroblewski, 96, Past International President of Lions Clubs International, a member of our PA Lions International Family, passed away on June 2nd.

Joseph L. Wroblewski, 96, Past International President of Lions Clubs International, devoted husband, father, grandfather, funeral director, veteran, humanitarian, and community leader passed away peacefully at home on June 2, 2026, surrounded by his children.

For more than seven decades, Joseph dedicated his life to service – service to his family, his community, his profession, and most notably to Lions Clubs International, whose mission of improving lives through humanitarian work became the guiding purpose of his life.

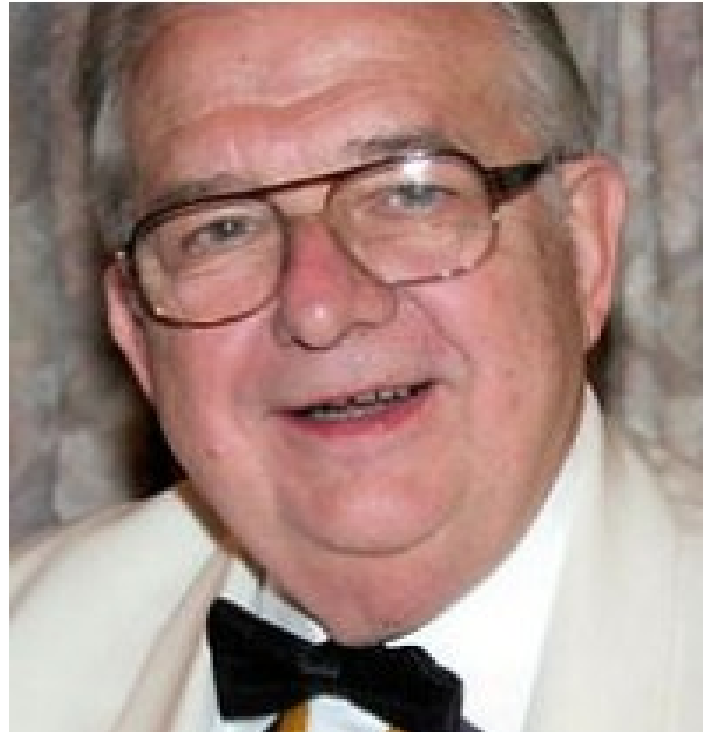
Born in Ashley, Pennsylvania, to Joseph L. Wroblewski and Irene Sobolewski Wroblewski, Joe was raised with the values of faith, hard work, compassion, and integrity that would define his character throughout his life. A graduate of Ashley High

School, he continued his education at Wilkes College and later earned a degree from Eckels College of Mortuary Science in 1952.

Joe honorably served in the United States Army during the Korean War. Upon returning home, he established his first funeral home in Ashley in 1954 and later expanded his work by acquiring the former John J. Baloga Funeral Home in Forty Fort. Together with his beloved wife, Normajean, he served generations of families with dignity, compassion, and professionalism for more than six decades. During life's most difficult moments, Joe and Normajean became trusted sources of comfort, guidance, and reassurance for countless families throughout Northeastern Pennsylvania.

His entrepreneurial spirit led him to several successful ventures beyond funeral service. Though respected as a businessman, Joe believed that the true measure of a life was found in service to others.

A member of the Ashley Lions Club since 1954, Joe devoted more than



70 years to Lions Clubs International. Through decades of leadership and service, he rose through the organizations ranks, serving as District Governor, International Director, and ultimately as International President of Lions Clubs International during 1985-1986.

His leadership extended far beyond a single presidential term. Joe served as International Convention Chairperson, United Nations Liaison for 28 years, Chairman of the Coor-

minating Committee for China Affairs, and in numerous other capacities that helped shape the global direction of Lions Clubs International. His work carried him across continents, where he forged lifelong friendships, inspired service, and advanced humanitarian causes that improved countless lives

Welcome back and congratulations to DG Ron and thank you to IPDG Amy for a great year. Last year we had 17 clubs report their service, that is 63%. I know that number is greater than the Lions report states. I will look more into the issue and report the final numbers at the August 22 cabinet meeting. Last year thru 713 activities reported, we helped 327,739 people. We gave 19,325 hours of our time to do this. So, for every donated hour we helped just under 17 people.

I remember a little about what it was like in 1976 so trying to relay advice to the future generation could be thought provoking. Wendy said to take memories not just pictures. 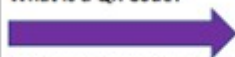
