

JAMES "JAY" COLEMAN MOUGHON III
INTERNATIONAL DIRECTOR Jay Moughon, from
Clifton, Virginia, USA was elected to serve a twoyear term as international director of Lions Clubs
International at the association's 104th
International Convention, June 24 through June 28,
2022 held in Montreal, Quebec, Canada.

Director Moughon is a retired Army colonel and government civil servant. During his 42 years of service in the Army, his assignments included the command of a rocket and missile battalion comprised of 500 soldiers. He also served as an assistant professor of systems engineering at the

United States Military Academy, West Point, NY.

He is a distinguished military graduate of the University of Georgia with a Bachelor of Science degree in biology. He holds a Master of Science in operations research from the Naval Postgraduate School in Monterey, CA, and a Master of Science in national security affairs from the National War College in Washington, DC.

As a member of the Clifton Lions since 2001, he has held many offices within the association including zone chairperson, district GLT coordinator and has served as an LCI/LCIF board committee member. He is a graduate of the Regional Lions Leadership Institute, the Advanced Lions Leadership Institute, the Faculty Development Institute, and the Lions Certified Instructor Program. Through Lions University, he completed the requirements for bachelors, master's, and doctorate degrees.

Director Moughon and his wife, Nancy, are the proud parents of three wonderful children—two daughters and a son—and the grandparents to two perfect grandsons.

Dear Lions and Leos,

This is not my typical Global Action Team article, but as I write this month's piece, former President Jimmy Carter has been admitted to hospice. Still, I don't want to talk about Jimmy Carter the politician. Instead, I want to highlight **JIMMY CARTER**, the LION!

Mr. Carter began his Lions' journey by following in his father's footsteps and joining the Plains Lion Club in 1953, a week after resigning from the navy, a post that he assumed after graduating in the top 10 percent of his class at Annapolis in 1946. During his term as club president in 1957-58, the Plains Lions Club built and began to operate a community swimming pool, while also continuing their blindness prevention programs in Georgia and Honduras.

Lion Carter found Lionism to be a great way to engage in public service and helping him to expand his horizons. Furthermore, he acknowledged the many lessons he learned while serving his community as helping him as a politician and peacemaker, showing him the importance of caring for others.

In fact, Lion Jimmy claimed, "Lions changed my life. I would have never been ambitious enough to run for Governor of Georgia. I would have never dreamed of being President of the United States if it were not for the Lions."

Being zone chairperson, district governor and chairperson of the Council of Governors in Georgia, gave him visibility with the 208 Georgia Lions Clubs that played a vital role throughout his campaign for governor in 1970. During his presidential campaign in 1976, his "civic involvement as a Lion contributed to my identity as a community leader."

Most importantly, Lion Jimmy will long be remembered for his outstanding humanitarian service. In 1982, Lion Jimmy and his wife, Rosalynn, founded The Carter Center to "advance human rights and diminish human suffering around the world."

Then, in 1994, the Carter Center partnered with Lions Clubs International Foundation's (LCIF) SightFirst program to focus on two diseases: trachoma, the leading infectious cause of global blindness, and river blindness, a parasitic disease that leads to blindness.


Due to this nearly 30 year partnership, LCIF has provided more than \$67 million to treat over 400 million people with medications. In addition, we have provided 800,000 surgeries to reverse advanced stages of trachoma and have built more than 3.2 million latrines to reduce the transfer of germs, thus working to eradicate treatable blindness throughout the world.

Beginning with our initial donation to the Carter Center's River Blindness Project in Nigeria, Lions Clubs International Foundation has become one of the Carter Center's most significant partners.

Furthermore, the Carters helped to publicize Habitat for Humanity, where Lion Jimmy and his wife are credited with building more than 80 homes, before officially retiring in 2020.

Because of his efforts to establish peace between Egypt and Israel, as well as the SALT II treaty with the Soviet Union, and the

establishment of U.S. diplomatic relations with the People's Republic of China, he earned a Nobel Peace Prize in 2002. Consequently, Lion Jimmy has nominated Lions International on numerous occasions for this coveted prize.



What an outstanding legacy for a man who truly displayed the "Heart of a Lion."

"Not above you, Not beneath you, but with you," Lion Jimmy.



Zone Chair Training


Are you interested in learning more about Lions and District 14-E?



Founded by Jonni Parker, Chasing Greatness is an organization to support persons 18 years and younger with hearing loss by creating funding opportunities for hearing aids and the enhancement of life skills. Jonni is a hearing-impaired athlete who has spent her life "chasing greatness" by not allowing her hearing impairment to define her. She has played volleyball since age 11, with four pairs of hearing aids. She graduated from Penn State in 2022 as a four-year Division 1 collegiate athlete. She is currently a first-grade teacher in Ohio, and she also coaches at Munciana Volleyball Club.

At Penn State, Jonni was the Big 10 Freshman of the year in 2018, and

she went on to be a three-year volleyball captain. She is a four-time AVCA All-American and has earned two Academic All-Big 10 Awards. She was a candidate for the Senior Class Award for Volleyball (only 30 nominated) and was awarded the Big 10 Medal of Honor and the Penn State Ernest B. McCoy Award, presented annually to one senior student-athlete who has combined successful athletic participation with academic excellence.



LITPC YOUTH SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM GUIDELINES FOR PIN TRADING CLUBS



- 1. Application forms and information will be posted on the LITPC website. Identical information will be published in the first LITPC bulletin of the year. Successive bulletins will contain directions to download the Scholarship Application from the LITPC website.
- 2. It is recommended that each pin trading club establish a Scholarship Committee of at least three members in addition to a chairperson.
- 3. In areas or multiple districts without a pin trading club, members are encouraged to establish a Scholarship Committee of at least three members and a chairperson. When the Committee is established, please inform PDG Stephen Staudinger LITPC Scholarship Chair at 24615 NE Stegert Drive, Battle Ground, WA 98604 5337.
- 4. Guidelines will be released or can be downloaded from the LITPC website.
- 5. All pin trading clubs will be encouraged to post applications and scholarship information in their bulletins and on their websites. Also, please post scholarship information in your various sub-district bulletins and websites.
- 6. It will be the responsibility of pin trading clubs to share scholarship information with Leo Clubs in their states/multiple
- 7. Completed applications will be processed through state and/or multiple district pin trading clubs. In states/areas that do not establish a Scholarship Committee, applications should be sent to the nearest pin trading club as listed on the LITPC website. http://www.litpc.org/PinTradingClubsPins.html
- 8. Each pin trading club may submit two applications to LITPC from their area and two applications from a state/area that does not have a pin trading club.
- 9. Each pin trading club may designate its own deadline date for the acceptance of applications. A deadline of April 1, 2023 is recommended.
- 10. Scholarship Chairpersons are encouraged NOT to wait until the last minute to submit scholarship applications to their committee for judging. When 20 or more applications are received, send an equal number of applications to committee members to start prioritizing those they feel are the best applications. Immediately after your deadline EACH committee member can submit their top application to the chairperson. The committee then can select the top two applications to be sent to PDG Stephen Staudinger LITPC Scholarship Chair at 24615 NE Stegert Drive, Battle Ground, WA 98604 5337 by May 15, 2023.
- 11. Scholarship applications may be duplicated; however, applications which have been altered in any way will not be accepted by the LITPC.
- 12. The Secretary of the LITPC Scholarship Committee will accept applications postmarked on or before May 15, 2023. The Secretary will select an LITPC Board Member to review all applications for compliance.
- 13. The LITPC Scholarship Committee will evaluate all applications. Each Scholarship Committee member will evaluated all applications using a point system to determine the scholarship winner.
- 14. The scholarship winner will be announced at the Annual Meeting of the LITPC.




