Lions International's MyLion will now let us report our service through this app/website. A training seminar will be presented at our district convention on April 13th. Reporting our service will mean more than ever. Did you know that any service you do can be entered as service performed by a Lion? When you volunteer at a library, assist a food pantry, or delivering meals, these count as service. Since the beginning of my term, there were 340 activities entered with 3,816 hours of service helping 47,994 people. Just imagine if everyone entered their service hours. And by the way, you can still enter them even if you worked them in any previous months beginning in July.



What are we asking from you? Well, there are 3 separate requests.

1. Please try to increase your club's contributions to Beacon Lodge this year. Make your contribution directly to Beacon Lodge, or through the district projects donation form. If you are in need of a special way to recognize a member, consider purchasing a brick on their memorial walkway or perhaps a Carl Shoemaker Fellowship. Every year our district pays the costs for all of the campers that attend from our district with the exception of the camper's \$75 registration fee. Does your club help with a full or partial campership? Contact PDG Cliff Martin or PDG Carol Richardson to help out this year.
2. Help us spread the word and recruit new campers. We Lions did a great job years back in recruiting campers and many of them are still attending now as older adults, which is fantastic. However, the future of this camp depends on us acquainting younger campers and their families with our program. The adult camp and children's camp are separate and unfortunately, much of the space in our children's program is vacant. Help us fill it up this year. Children's Village has specialized sessions for youth with autism, blind and visually impaired, ADHD, and those needing one-on-one assisted living care. In addition, the camp hosts families of wounded warriors as well. Brochures are available if you would like, or refer candidates to the web site beaconlodge.com.
3. Help Beacon Lodge conserve their limited funds by contributing items from the camp wish list attached to this newsletter. You can contact PDG Cliff Martin or PDG Carol Richardson and they can take donations to camp on their next board meeting visit.

Together, we can help introduce an entire new generation of campers to our wonderful Beacon Lodge and ensure its vitality for years to come. Let's keep this camp built by Pennsylvania Lions as something in which we all take pride. Make sure you share it with others in your community and let them know we welcome them. Think about inviting PDG Cliff or PDG Carol to present at an upcoming club meeting to help your club learn more about Beacon Lodge. Better yet, plan to visit the camp on Lions Appreciation Day, scheduled for Sunday, July 14th and see it for yourself. Thanks for supporting our Beacon Lodge.

Sharing the Love in February


One way to show we are open to families and women in our Lion Clubs is to show it everywhere.

How Important is Leadership to Your Club?

Leadership starts with the club president and continues down to every committee chairperson.

What is leadership? Leadership is motivation, results, and inspiration. Leaders have a vision and share it with others. Leaders have motivation and channel that motivation to other club members to achieve their objectives. Leaders must have empathy; being sensitive to the feelings and thoughts of club members. Leaders are at the forefront to lead and guide their club. Most important is for a leader to know when to step back and let their committee members take the initiative to be successful.

What is a good leader? A leader must be humble. Look at the strength of you members over their weaknesses. Show members gratitude for a job well done and thank them often. A leader must communicate. Do idea sharing with members about goals and objectives. Good leaders listen to their members. Ask members what they think and what their concerns may be. Most important is leaders use “we” instead of “I” when talking. We as Lions are a team of people with common goals. Leaders are very important to the survival of Lions Clubs.

The 2018-2019 Lions’ fiscal year is quickly coming to an end. Does your club have a committee to get nominations for 2019-2020 club officers? A nomination meeting must be held no later than sometime in March. Elections for officers should be held in April. After elections are complete an officer reporting form, PU-101, must be completed and sent to International Headquarters. This can be sent either by mail or electronically. Deadline to submit the form is May 15. Without officer information LCI has no way of sending important and helpful information to these individuals. Last year the District 14-E had three clubs that did not submit a PU-101. There were 25 clubs without a service chairperson, eight clubs without a membership chairperson, and six clubs without a 1st Vice President. Let us all work together so we can be 100 percent successful in electing club officers and reporting them to MyLCI for this coming fiscal year.

Hello Fellow Lions;

Today am writing to you about the Lions International Convention in Milan, Italy. Some information has come to my attention that I feel needs to be presented to anyone who has any intention of attending the international convention. The following will require your attention; please review as timing may be an important factor.

1. Passport – it must be current and valid for six (6) months after your return
2. Health insurance – Medicare does not cover you out of the country; check your supplement insurance for coverage.
3. Travel Insurance – check with your travel agent to see if they recommend this coverage. Estimated cost \$100 or more per person. Death benefits are important here.
4. Visa – not required if you are a United States citizen.
5. Currency – Italy uses the euro which can be obtained state side from various agencies, one being AAA, for a fee.

The committee hopes that this will be helpful information for you to make your experience an enjoyable one at the international convention. If more information is needed please contact me.

Presently we serve three elementary schools and the intermediate school in the Norwin School District. We are currently feeding over 50 children through our program. It takes almost \$400 to provide food for one child for a school year. That amounts to around \$20,00 this year.




