# **District Governor's Message**



Greetings Fellow Lions,

As you read this newsletter, I will be in Boston at the International Convention where I will officially be sworn in as your District Governor for the upcoming 2023-2024 Lions Year. I want to thank everyone who agreed to serve as Cabinet Members and Committee Chairs for this upcoming year. I am looking forward to our year together and have every confidence that we (my team and all of you) will work very hard to accomplish many great things!

My theme for the year is "Transformation-Change-Rebirth", and you will be hearing more about that during my District Governor visits, but to give you a quick peek, it means that

we all need to transform/change in order for rebirth/growth to occur. We need to be open to new members and their ideas in order to continue to grow Lionism into the future. I will also have additional information for you in regards to the new International President's (Dr Patti Hill) environmental theme "Changing the World" when it is provided to me to be shared with you.

The District has several goals to achieve this year, and I know if we all work together, we will be able to achieve great things. I plan on having updates in every newsletter so everyone can see the District's progress toward each goal which will hopefully spark you all into action. The District's goals are:

- 1. Increase Club Officer Training to 20%--if every club could send at least 2 of their club officers to the training, this goal would not only be achieved, but exceeded!
- 2. Appoint 1 new Zone Chairperson—our District is in dire need of Zone Chairpersons, if you are interested in learning more, please reach out to myself or PDG Chuck.
- 3. Start 1 new club branch with at least 5 charter members—membership is down not only in our District, but all over the world, so we need to do all we can to increase our numbers!
- 4. Attain positive membership growth of 1 by the year's end—remember, even if your club adds new members, we need to be mindful of the losses we have as the losses are far outweighing our gains—we need to plan to replace ourselves as well as our older members!
- 5. Increase Club service reporting to 50%--I know you are all doing service in your communities, but we really need to strive to get it reported—help is available with this—it is vital when obtaining funding from major contributors!
- 6. Increase LCIF (Lions Clubs International Foundation) individual donors to 3%--PID Cindy will be leading this effort as our District's LCIF Coordinator, and she has some fun opportunities up her sleeve for us to achieve this goal as well as exceed it!

7. District Wide Service Project—This is my personal goal—I would like to expand the book drive for Pediatric Cancer patients to include the entire district and for all clubs to take part and there are two parts to it. As you know, for the past several years, many clubs/zones have taken part in this project—just think of how many more children's lives we could touch if every member of District 14-Ewould send a book! The books would need to be collected by the first of November so they can be labeled with a Lions sticker, and shipped off for distribution at Christmas. Now, enter a new twist—I would like to apply for a Lions of PA Foundation matching grant to provide Ninetendo Switch Systems and games to the children for Easter. In order to be able to apply for the grant, I need everyone who provides books to also provide a receipt so I can total the amount spent on books in order to get the games. We need to do everything we can to bring a bit of relief to the pediatric cancer patients and their families, and we can help with this through books and video games! This project means a lot to me as I could not imagine what the families go through during the process. I also plan to invite Lion Ashley Grimm to our Spring Rally to let us know the impact of our efforts on the families at the Hershey Medical Center.

July is looking to be a very busy month already...the International Convention in Boston, Beacon Lodge Appreciation Day/75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary celebration, the District's 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Golf Outing, my club visits starting, and the Banner Passing Ceremony. As I said before, we need everyone's help in order to make all of these events a success. No matter how big or how small, every little bit helps. When you attend events outside of your club and comfort zone, you meet new people, generate new ideas, and continue to flourish and grow!

I know this looks like a lot, but I know we can achieve these goals and have fun while doing it! Please do not hesitate to reach out if you have any questions or concerns throughout the year as I am here to help you and your club succeed as well. Let me know when your club has an activity planned and if I am available, I will stop by to either help or support!

# **First Vice District Governor Note**

Greetings fellow Lions,

My goal in drafting a monthly article is to be concise, and to hopefully share information of value to you. If you are taking the time to read this, I want it to be a productive use of your time.

My "day job" is in the field of information security. In addition to Lions-related content, I will share recent information security trends with you to help keep you safe online. Here we go!

### 1. Baskets Still Needed for Knights of the Blind Golf Outing on July 22.

### 2. Email Phishing: Unknown Links in Email Messages

"Phishing" is the name given to fraudulent email messages intended to trick you into giving up personal or financial information. They often pretend to be from a utility or credit card company and often display logos you might recognize. They typically contain language intended to get you to ACT before you can STOP AND THINK. Language intended to invoke fear, anxiety, or the need for fast action should always make you stop and consider whether or not the email is legitimate.

- Banks, credit card companies, and other legitimate businesses will not contact you by email to request personal information or to ask you to provide or change passwords. Payment reminders and online bills are only real if you have personally set up that arrangement in advance.
- The Internal Revenue Service will never contact you by email to extract payment.
- Another red flag of a scam is any time you are asked to pay in order to receive something (like a prize) and anytime that "gift cards" are the requested form of payment.

QR codes are those square graphics filled with dots that are designed to be scanned by a smartphone to deliver you to a mobile website. QR codes are basically internet links, and you should treat them with the same care (and skepticism) that you would a web link you get in an email.

What should you do if you think you might be facing an email that might not be for real? If you get an email from the bank, the gas company, Amazon, wherever - and you are *not sure* it's legit – don't reply to the email message. Instead, call them. If you can't call, find a legitimate email address on the company's website to contact. Most companies post security information for customers on their websites.

Stay safe out there, and don't forget to donate some baskets!



## Hello Fellow Lions.

I am honored to serve as District 14E's GMA Lead. GMA stands for Global Membership Approach. The GMA is a proven membership program that has proven effective in areas that has implemented the program. Area Leader PID Cindy shared that over half of the Multiple Districts that used the GMA had a net membership growth. As a district, we are looking to have a net increase in membership for the 2023 – 2024 Lions year. If we accomplish this, it will be the first time in many years we have had a net gain.

We will be using the GMA approach on the District and Club levels. We need our clubs to stop giving excuses about why they can't increase their membership and start realizing the reasons why they can and must increase membership. You won't be in this alone. I and the entire GAT Team will be at your call. We plan on giving you the training and resources you need to make and execute a reasonable membership growth plan. We ask that each club has a Membership Night in **October**. We ask that you do this membership event a little differently than the usual informational meeting. The information about Lionism and the costs involved can still and should be given but we ask that you conduct a simple service project that the club and invitees can take part in. This could be something simple like making flannel tie blankets or eyeglass case first aid kits. You can come up with your own project ideas, but the idea is to get them involved in service and not bored and turned off through a straight informational meeting.

There are four parts for successful club membership growth:

- 1. Build a Team: put together the team that is going to be **responsible** for carrying out the **club's** goals.
- 2. Build a Vision: the team meets with the club to decide what the **club members** want to accomplish with the club's membership. If the club members aren't involved and aware of what is happening, success is difficult if not impossible to accomplish.
- **3. Build a Plan:** without a plan nothing will happen. The plan must be simple, measurable, accountable, realistic and timebound. For example: 3 new members by December 1, 2023 the membership chair, service chair, Team Members and club members will be responsible. The plan should be reviewed and adjusted as needed. It is a living document.
- **4. Build Success:** by following and working the plan. When you have met your goal, it is time to do 2 things. 1 Celebrate your club's success and 2 make a new plan and keep up the momentum generated by the former plan's success.

The district will be looking to adding new clubs and replacing clubs in areas that have lost their Lions Club. This is in addition to being there and giving assistance to the clubs as needed. We have always been known as the Excellent District, let's show the rest of Pennsylvania just what excellent Lions we are.

May you meet with success in all your endeavors.

Dear Lions and Leos,

How much do you know about our Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF)? Last year, at this time, we were eagerly anticipating the final results of Campaign 100, our most challenging fundraising effort, to date. Of course, we were thrilled to hear at the Montreal Convention that the campaign exceeded our expectations by raising more than \$325 million.

These funds are providing new grant programs for Hunger and Childhood Cancer. They are helping to mobilize the Refugees and Displaced Persons fund to provide safety and security for those fleeing their homes during immensely challenging times. Moreover, these funds enable us to quickly award grants in times of disaster and global crises, like hurricanes, floods, tornadoes, wildfires, the war in Ukraine, and the COVID-19 pandemic.



Unfortunately, many Lions in North America have the misconception that those funds go offshore. Here in 14-E, we have been the recipient of several LCIF grants that have supported our Blind Association, various communities affected by floods, as well as Covid. Unfortunately, only about 6% of individual Lions throughout the world support LCIF. So, as this year's District LCIF Chairperson, I am challenging EACH member to make a personal contribution of \$5, \$10, \$25, or whatever you can comfortably afford to assist in LCIF's humanitarian endeavors.

As Lions, we can certainly be proud to say that "Every cent donated to LCIF is used to help others" because the interest from our investments covers administrative costs. There aren't too many organizations that can make that statement.

So, please consider personally supporting OUR Lions Foundation this year. Thank you for all that you do to serve others.

# CLUB MEMBERSHIP GOALS

Membership in the District is in the 700's right now. We have lost several Clubs in the last few years. It can happen very easily. You must work to not let that happen.

With the new Lions Year your Club needs to set its goals and increasing membership <u>has to</u> be one of those goals.

How many new members are you going to bring into your Club this year? Work with your Club Members and Board of Directors to set a Membership Goal.

You do not need to bring in 10 members this year (though you should aim high). Bring Someone...Even just 1. Who knows what that 1 person might do?



# **BRING SOMEONE**

As your District Global Membership Team Chairperson, I am bringing a new Membership theme to the <u>District</u> called "Bring Someone."

# What is Bring Someone?

Bring Some is the idea of bringing in new Members, orienting Members in what Lionism is about, and constantly engaging Lions so that they feel a sense of satisfaction through Service and Leadership so that their Membership is retained.

# Bring Someone – Member Recruiting

Does your Club have enough members to do everything that you want to do? Are there other opportunities for Service that your Club could be doing if you had more members. What happens to your Club if you were no longer able to Serve tomorrow? Bring Someone to strengthen your Club's impact on the community and to carry on the hard work that you and others before you have started.

# Bring Someone - Member Orientation

Orientation is important to new Members but is also critical for Members of all years of Service. Things change, new needs arise, new programs and opportunities emerge. If someone asked you about a Lions program that your Club, District, Multiple District or Lions International does, could you explain it to them in a way that would make them want to be more involved? Bring Someone to learn about Lionism.

# Bring Someone – Member Retention

We work hard to bring in new Members but are we working hard to retain those members? Are your Club Members engaged? Do they feel a level of satisfaction in the time they spend with your Club? If a Club Member does not feel engaged or that they are volunteering to their full potential, they will lose interest and maybe even leave. Can you overwhelm a Lion by trying to push them into more than they want or are able to do at a given time? You sure can. Bring Someone into the level of Lionism appropriate for them.

# Bring Someone – Service

It is the reason we are Lions — Service. We need Membership to be able to perform Service. Use Service as your recruiting tool. It is not necessary to be a Member on a Club roster to help with Service. Bring Someone to your next project. Tell them you could use their help. Use the Service project as the opportunity to teach the potential member the good we do as Lions.

A: Start a Branch Club. Do you have people in your community with a common interest – golfers, motorcyclists, cyber professionals? A Branch Club can be formed with as few as 5 members.

# Q: Is Bring Someone different than any of the other Membership recruiting methods (Just Ask, Ask One, Modified PA Plan, etc.)?

A: That depends on you. Membership plans come in many shapes and sizes. In talking with Lions, I have heard them say "that this has been tried before." "We had that type of plan before." Okay, so what do you do to grow Membership? The plan doesn't have to be this one or that one. It should be what works for you. When it works, make sure you share it.

### Q: Who are the Members of the District Global Membership Team?

A: The District Governor, the VDGs, the Zone Chairs, the Club level Membership Chairpersons, the Members of your Club, You!!!!!




You've probably seen many pictures and stories of Leader Dog clients confidently navigating life with their white canes and guide dogs, but there's a lot that goes into those success stories!
