

Happy New Year 2019!

Will this be a great year of service for your Lions Club? Notice I said service, not fundraising. We Lions do a lot of fundraising. Some clubs only do fundraising and check writing. These are very valuable types of service, no doubt. But the best way to get the community, and potential new members, interested in your club is by living our motto: We Serve!

Challenge your club to undertake one new service project before the end of June. Get out into the community and get your hands dirty. The options are endless. Need help? Partner with another Lions Club near you, or partner with another organization like the Boy Scouts or Girl Scouts, Rotary, or the Kiwanis. Students are always looking for service hours opportunities and may be willing to help if you reach out. Ask them to bring a parent along to help too.

Find a great way to make an impact on your community. Build a pavilion at a park, clean up a park, do a roadside cleanup, plant trees or flowers, provide vision screenings, provide diabetes screenings – whatever it is, make your club visible and invite other non-members to join you. STATE DUES STRUCTURE

State per capita dues are collected to provide revenue to defray the administrative expenses of the Multiple District and each sub-District and a Multiple District Convention Fund, annual per capita dues of \$16.00 per member per year are collected. These dues are collected in two semi-annual payments based upon a club's membership total as shown by Lions Clubs International (LCI) as of July 1 and January 1 of each fiscal year.

As is the case with LCI for international dues, state per capita dues are not pro-rated for members added or dropped from club membership rolls after July 1 and before December 30 and/or after January 1 and before June 30.

State per capita dues collected are used, distributed and credited as follows:

- State Convention Administrative Fund: \$0.45/member/year
- International Convention Fund: \$0.85/member/year
- Promotional Fund: \$0.35/member/year
- District Governors International Conv. Fund: \$0.35/member/year
- Sub-District Administrative Fund: \$2.50/member/year
- PA News Publication Fund (The PRIDE): \$1.50/member/year
- All State Band: \$1.50/member/year

Hello Fellow Lions;

Today am writing to you about the Lions International Convention in Milan, Italy. Some information has come to my attention that I feel needs to be presented to anyone who has any intention of attending the international convention. The following will require your attention; please review as timing may be an important factor.

1. Passport – it must be current and valid for six (6) months after your return
2. Health insurance – Medicare does not cover you out of the country; check your supplement insurance for coverage.
3. Travel Insurance – check with your travel agent to see if they recommend this coverage. Estimated cost \$100 or more per person. Death benefits are important here.
4. Visa – not required if you are a United States citizen.
5. Currency – Italy uses the euro which can be obtained state side from various agencies, one being AAA, for a fee.

The committee hopes that this will be helpful information for you to make your experience an enjoyable one at the international convention. If more information is needed please contact me.

Why: To select a Multiple District 14 Lion as an endorsed candidate for the high office of International Director at the 102nd Annual Lions Clubs International Convention July 4-9, 2019, in Milan, Italy.

When: Saturday, February 2, 2019

Where: Altoona Grand Hotel, 1 Sheraton Drive, Altoona, PA

Who: Each Multiple District 14 Lions club in good standing with Lions Clubs International, Multiple District 14 and its respective sub-district as of January 1, 2019, shall be entitled to have one (1) certified delegate per each 10 members listed on MyLCI as of December 31, 2018.

Past District Governors are also each entitled to one delegate credential, which does not count against a club's delegate allocation.

PLEASE NOTE: *Club delegate credentials, as well as those of Past District Governors who are members of that club, will be denied if a club has an unpaid LCI, MD-14 and/or sub-district per capita dues balance as of January 1, 2019.*

How: Certification of delegates and voting for an endorsed candidate for the high office of International Director will be conducted in a one-stop process between the hours of 8:00 AM and 10:00 AM on Saturday, February 2, 2019, at the Altoona Grand Hotel in Altoona, PA.

Results of the Special Election will be announced during the third 2018-2019 PA State Council of Lions Clubs' Council of Governors regular meeting scheduled to convene at 1:30 p.m. Saturday, February 2, 2019, at the Altoona Grand Hotel.

Membership Opportunities

A quick-reference guide to membership options for new Lions.



Every club needs members in order to achieve its service goals. To help clubs recruit new members, LCI offers several membership options to community members who want to volunteer and serve their communities as Lions.

MEMBERSHIP TYPES

In addition to regular membership, LCI offers special membership programs for families, college students, former Leos and young adults.

Regular Member

This is our "standard" membership. Regular membership is for community members interested in volunteering, serving the community and making our world a better place. Regular members pay an entrance fee (US\$35) and full international dues (US\$43). Additional district, multiple-district and club dues apply.

Family Member

The Family Membership Program provides families with the opportunity to receive a special dues discount when they join a Lions club together. The first family member (head of household) pays full international dues (US\$43), and up to four additional family members pay only half the international dues (US\$21.50). All family members pay the one-time entrance fee (US\$35).

The Family Membership Program is open to family members who are (1) eligible for Lions membership, (2) currently in or joining the same club, and (3) living in the same household and related by birth, marriage or other legal relationship. To receive the family membership dues rate, complete the Family Unit Certification Form and submit it with the MMR, or complete the certification on MyLCI. When chartering a club, complete the certification on the Report of Charter Members.

Student Member

Student membership allows students to make new friends and help others in their community at the same time. Students enrolled in an educational institution who are between the age of legal majority and through age 30 pay no entrance or charter fee and half international dues (US\$21.50). Students over age 30 who are joining a Campus Lions club pay a US\$10 entrance fee and full international dues. To receive the student-member dues rate, complete the Student Member Certification Form and submit with the MMR, or complete the certification on MyLCI. When chartering a club, complete the certification on the Report of Charter Members.

Leo Lion Member

Leo Lion membership allows current or former Leos between the age of legal majority and through age 30, who have been a Leo for at least a year and a day, to continue doing volunteer work with LCI as a Lion. Leo Lions pay no entrance fee or charter fee and pay half international dues (US\$21.50). To receive the Leo Lion dues rate, complete the Leo to Lion Certification and Years of Service Form and submit with the MMR or club charter application, or complete the certification on MyLCI. To encourage Leo Lions to invite their friends, young adults between the age of legal majority and through age 30 who join a Leo Lions club receive the same fee waivers and dues discounts as Leo to Lion members.

Former Leo Member

Former Leos over the age of 30 who have been a Leo for at least a year and a day pay no entrance fee or charter fee when joining a Lions club. To receive the fee waiver, complete the Leo to Lion Certification and Years of Service Form and submit with the MMR or club charter application, or complete the certification on MyLCI.
