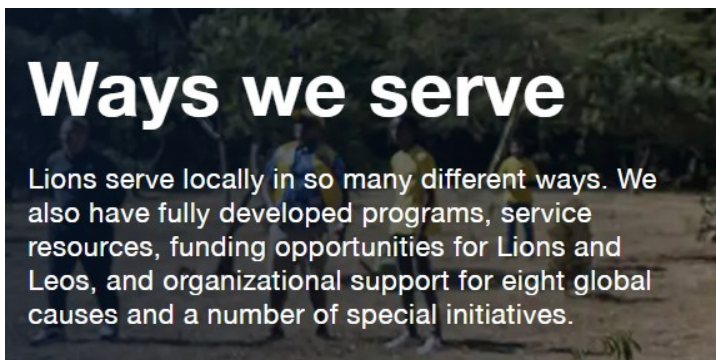

Dear Lions and Leos,

As we approach the end of this Lions' year, we need to evaluate the health of our clubs and ensure that our members are engaged, satisfied, and energized. Members are more likely to leave if they don't see results from their efforts. Unfortunately, some members, who carry too much of the workload, burn out.

Consider if your projects are relevant, exciting, and well-organized, or if you're relying on the same routines and the same volunteers. Tools like the Club Quality Initiative and member satisfaction resources can help clubs identify what to keep, what should be improved, and what should be changed. Just as important...

does your community realize who you are and what you do? We need to tell our stories. Some are more compelling than others, but our stories need to be shared. Think about when you comforted a family who lost everything in a fire or flood, or when you provided a new pair of eyeglasses to help a child see clearly for the first time, or distributed food at the local food pantry, or delivered baskets

during the holidays. Perhaps you built a ramp or raised funds for the library, the fire department, or a sick resident. These are powerful stories that strengthen your members' pride and help the community understand your impact and to consider ways in which they can support the cause..

Thank you for all that you do to "Lead to Serve and Serve to Lead."

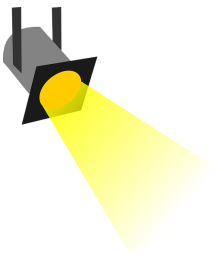

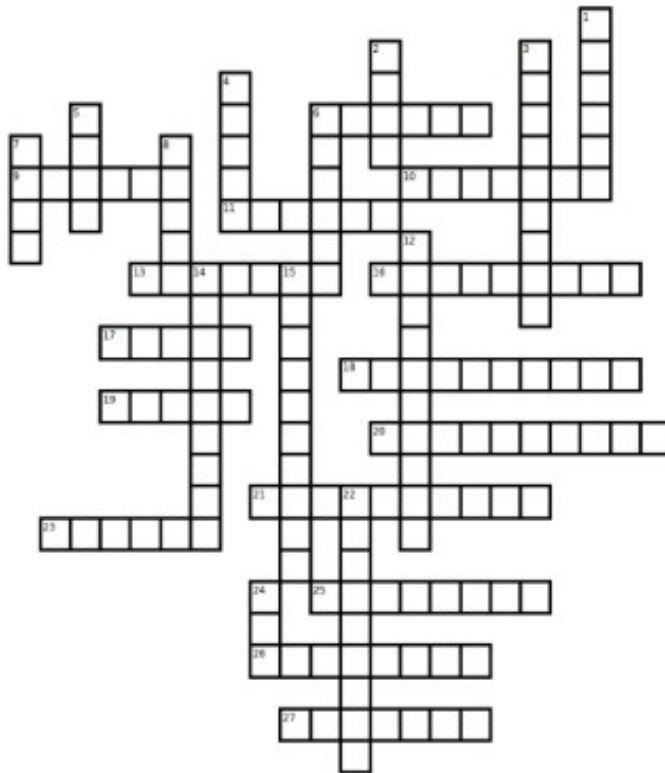

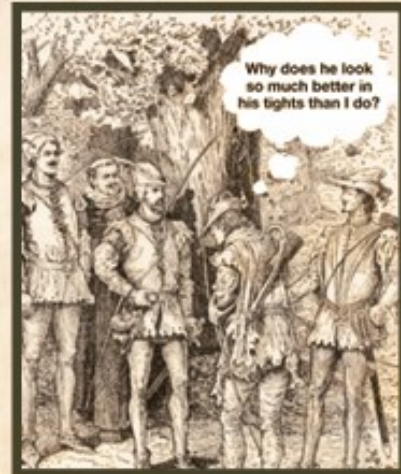
